

Procedure

- 1. Choose the functional-language parts your learners are going to use in your lesson from the **sample lists**. Adapt them to your learners' language level, e.g. a maximum of 2 items per category for A2-B1 learners.
- 2. Beam your list onto the wall/screen.
- 3. Tell your learners to choose 1 (2) expressions per category.
- 4. Tell them to memorise these expressions. Set a suitable time limit.
- 5. Ask them to use the expressions chosen in the following oral task.
- 6. Keep the list visible for your learners to consult during the task.
- 7. After the task evaluate. Have your learners give each other feedback on which expressions they have used.
- 8. Have them write down their 3 (4) absolute favourites.
- Repeat the above steps with the same list 3-4 times. Then your learners will have acquired the new expressions. Offer them a new list.
